

GENERAL GUIDELINES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. All activities carried shall be done in such a manner to prevent any unreasonable impact on the environment or public health or to domestic animals;
2. The Pest Control Operator shall supervise any applicator operating under his control at all times
3. The Holder of the License shall be responsible for all actions of any persons in his work place who performs any function pursuant to which this license is granted;
4. The Pesticides Control Board may suspend a license for breach of the regulations or any guidelines issued pursuant to the license;
5. Every pest control operator shall at all times have his license on him
6. Must use professional product approved for the control of public health nuisance pests.
7. No agricultural products shall be used on any establishments used for dwelling, sporting, educational and food handling.

TRAINING PROGRAM:

1. Program consists of 3 modules
 2. Each module lasts 2 days
 3. After each module, there is a written exam, applicants must score a minimum of 75% to move on to the next module.
 4. At the end of the 3 modules, applicants are required to do a practical exam at a location of their choice.
 5. Upon successful completion of both the written and practical phases of the training, the applicant is certified as a Trade Applicator.
- Training fees apply
 - The license is valid for 5 years.

WHO ARE TRADE APPLICATORS?

"Trade Applicator" is the title given to a person engaged in the application of pesticides as a trade or profession.

PEST EXTERMINATOR

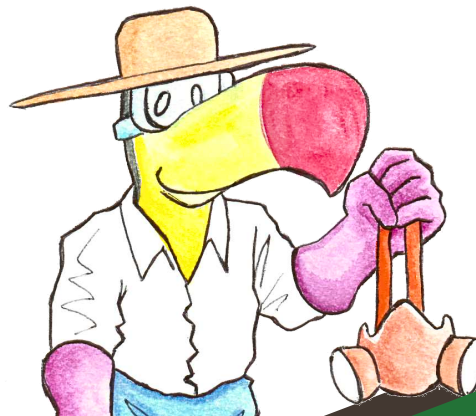
"Pest exterminator" means a person or company contracted or employed to control pests infesting or causing damage to buildings or premises that may be dwellings, places of work, industrial premises or storage facilities and who may have to take action to control such pests in the immediate vicinity of affected buildings.

Do you need a license to be a Pest Exterminator?

Yes, you need to be trained and certified by the Pesticides Control Board to provide this type of service to clients.

How do I get Trained and Certified?

The Board conducts training sessions to meet the requirements of The Certified User Regulations, S.I. No.112 of 1996, Schedule 3 (Regulations 2 & 5)



REQUIREMENTS:

- > To read and understand the pesticide label, following dosage, application, and precautionary direction therein;
- > Understand general principles of safe and effective pesticide use, storage and disposal;
- > Calibrate and maintain specialized application equipment;
- > choose and use the specified (appropriate) pesticides(s) required for his business; and,
- > Understand responsibilities towards clients, employees, and the public.
